Tech TipIt's just a little wet

My tech. tip for this edition is a reminder to check your coach for leaks of all types. For many of us, the months of April and May start our camping season. Usually it starts with a visual inspection of the exterior of the coach. It concludes with a check for leaks inside. This gives you a sense of how well it survived the winter of nonuse.

Most of us can easily spot a leak in the ceiling, but it's the small water leaks under the cabinets or in the hot water enclosure that we see and sometimes dismiss as a "I'll fix it later" moment.

We each should be aware of the large amount of wood that is used in the construction of motor homes and trailer and the effect that water can have when left to soak into wood. Water soaking can over time soften a wooden support or

flooring brace to the point where it can no longer support their weight or the equipment that maybe attached to them.

So my advice or tip to you for this year's pre-season is to dry your hands and reach under the sink. Run your fingers along the piping, and if you find moisture check it out and fix it right away.
